

Where to Find the Best Coffee at Walt Disney World

One of the best pieces of advice I can give for getting ahead of the crowds and reducing your time waiting in line is to get to the park before it opens. Which is sometimes very *very* early.

SO YOU ARE GOING TO NEED A GOOD CUP OF COFFEE.

There are two main coffee options in Walt Disney World: **Joffrey's Coffee & Tea Company and Starbucks.** Also, your Walt Disney World Resort room will be equipped with a coffee maker.

JOFFREY'S COFFEE & TEA COMPANY ON PROPERTY

- There are over 75 kiosks, cafes, markets, and restaurants serving Joffrey's Coffee around the theme parks and Disney Springs.
- Joffrey's is the official coffee of Walt Disney World Resorts and Parks.
- Joffrey's is known for serving seasonal coffees and drinks at some of their locations, and at EPCOT festivals.

JOFFREY'S TIPS

- You'll find complementary single-serve packets (and K-cups) in the resort hotel rooms and Disney blends (at Disney World and online) as whole bean, ground, or French press grind.
- Joffrey's offers everything from hot coffee, iced coffee, nitro cold brew, espresso latte, cappuccino, frozen coffee, alcoholic coffee drinks, and more.
- They also serve specialty coffee that is specific to the land. In Tomorrowland, as a homage to Mission to Mars in Tomorrowland - the Mission to S'mores latte is available cold or hot at the Joffrey's Coffee Revive kiosk.
- Check your My Disney Experience account app for the operating hours and full menu for each of Joffrey's serving locations.

Quick Tip:

Guests of Skyliner Resorts will find a nice Joffrey's Coffee kiosk at the Caribbean Beach Skyliner Station.

STARBUCKS ON PROPERTY

There are six Starbucks locations across Walt Disney World property. One in each of the theme parks and two in Disney Springs.

- Magic Kingdom – Main Street Bakery, on Main Street USA
- Epcot – Fountain View, located next to Club Cool
- Disney's Hollywood Studios – Trolley Car Cafe, Hollywood Boulevard
- Disney's Animal Kingdom – Creature Comforts, Discovery Island area near the bridge to Africa

- Disney Springs Marketplace – Next to World of Disney
- Disney Spring West Side – Next to Characters in Flight

STARBUCKS TIPS

- You'll find a combination of traditional Starbucks menu items and Disney specialties - like seasonally themed cupcakes.
- The theme park locations are open during park hours, including Early Theme Park Entry, which is a benefit to guests staying at Disney Resort hotels. Disney Springs locations are usually open from 8 am - midnight.
- Starbucks connoisseurs will be happy to know you can pay through the **Starbucks app, with a Starbucks gift card and earn rewards** on every purchase. At the Disney Springs locations, you can also redeem rewards.
- The popular “You Are Here” collectible mugs are also available at all six locations. Also, the specialty Starbucks Tumblers are my favorite souvenir!

WHAT ABOUT RESORT ROOM COFFEE MAKERS?

Guests traveling to Walt Disney World resort ask every day about the coffee makers in the resort rooms.

All Walt Disney World Resort guest rooms have some type of coffee maker. You should have coffee (and decaf), creamer, sugar, artificial sweetener and tea. If you need more, just ask housekeeping.

- Pop Century, All Star Resorts, and Art of Animation Rooms and Suites have a Cuisinart single serve coffee maker (flat round pods)
- Coronado Springs and Gran Destino Tower have a Keurig single serve coffee maker
- Port Orleans Riverside and French Quarter, and Caribbean Beach have a Cuisinart single serve coffee maker (flat round pods)
- DVC Villas, Studios, and Fort Wilderness Cabins have a standard drip, 12 cup coffee maker
- Polynesian, Grand Floridian, Contemporary, Wilderness Lodge, Yacht/Beach Club, Boardwalk, and Animal Kingdom Lodge have a Keurig single serve coffee maker.
