

Tips for Mickey's Not So Scary Halloween Party

Mickey's Not So Scary Halloween Party occurs on select nights, August-September. This special ticketed event takes place at Magic Kingdom Theme Park. You must purchase a separate ticket for this event, your standard Disney Theme Park Tickets on your package will not give you access to the Halloween Party.

Tips for Visiting Mickey's Not So Scary Halloween Party

- **Arrive at Magic Kingdom so you can enter at 4PM.** There will be designated ticket tapstiles for guests with Mickey's Not So Scary Halloween Party Tickets. Cast Members will give your family wristbands, which indicates you are a ticketed guest for Mickey's Not So Scary.
- Be sure to pick up an exclusive park map and times guide for the event.
- Make getting candy your last priority, and try to take pictures toward the beginning of the party when the lighting is still good.
- **Day guests will need to exit the park by 7PM.** It can be "crowded" between 4-7 PM, when day guests are still in the park, and party guests are arriving. This is a great time to be in the park to eat, enjoy some low wait "anytime" attractions, etc.
- Plan to have an early dinner either at your resort, in Magic Kingdom, or a nearby Magic Kingdom area resort, so you can get in line to meet any special characters shortly before 7PM, when the party actually starts.



- Jack Skellington and Sally from the Nightmare before Christmas, and sometimes the Seven Dwarfs **only appear** during the Halloween Party. If you'd like to see them, get in line very early so you can see them. You can find their meeting location on the Mickey's Not So Scary Halloween

map and Times Guide. These are often available as a PDF after the first few parties. You can likely find one online with a quick Google search.

- Enjoy the Magic Kingdom attractions between 7-9PM. This is an ideal time to ride with little to no wait, especially if meeting characters is NOT your priority.
- **The first “Boo to You Parade” is typically at 8:15.** If possible, get a spot in Frontierland, as it starts in the proximity of Big Thunder Mountain. We like to see the first parade to be sure we see it in case we are tired and ready to go back to the resort when the second parade takes place later in the evening.



- Enjoy more attractions, the evening castle entertainment, and trick or treat around Magic Kingdom. Also, look for any characters you may have missed. Try to save trick or treating as you exit the park, or are almost ready to leave. You don't want to carry around your candy all night, and be sure to bring a large bag for your candy. You will get A LOT!
- If you didn't catch the first Boo to You Parade, you won't want to miss the second one at 11:15 p.m. This is also a good time to trick or treat, and ride any last few attractions.



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
